I believe most friars in attendance would agree that we left Colombia with a renewed appreciation for our international brotherhood, especially in the Americas, and a renewed commitment to follow the example of our beloved founder, St. Francis, who desired simply to follow in the footsteps of Jesus.



The theme of our meetings in Colombia offered us a perfect prelude to the holy season of Lent, which calls us each year to renewal, penance, and joy in preparation for the great celebrations of Jesus' Resurrection at Easter. We know that the cross and the tomb never had the final word. Rather, the Father's love and mercy did—which raised Jesus from the dead, conquered sin, and opened for us the way to eternal life. If that doesn't revive us, what will?

I thank you, in advance, for your continued prayers for the friars here in our Province and throughout the world. Thank you especially for your prayers for vocations. God's blessings on you and yours!



Around the Province

Fr. Joseph Flynn, Chaplain and Educator, Dies at 83



Reflecting on his life for *The Capuchin Journey* in 2016, Fr. Joseph Flynn cherished his years in formation as a young friar. In his initial formation, as he put it, "fraternity happened." Being together for prayer, study, meals, and recreation—including football games and musicals—made fraternity happen. It came very naturally: he said "it came through osmosis" because the brothers spent all their time together.

Father Joe, who died on Jan. 12, would spend his lifetime ministering to youths in parishes and colleges, and also to our friars in formation. He cited his own formation into brotherhood as the source of his ministry. He believed that a Capuchin's ministry to others begins with caring for one another in the fraternity, as in a family.

His experience of fraternal care gave him the grace to see others with great love. "He had the remarkable ability to see you for who you were ... and he was thrilled by what he saw," said Fr. Jack Rathschmidt, who preached the homily at Father Joe's funeral on Jan. 17. Father Jack quoted the Persian poet Hafiz to illustrate the rich life Father Joe lived: "Bring your cup near me. For I am a sweet old vagabond with an infinite leaking barrel of Light and Laughter and Truth that the Beloved has tied to my back."

An only child, John Joseph Flynn Jr. was born in Brooklyn and raised in Woodside, N.Y. Growing up at Saint Teresa Parish in Woodside, young Joe felt the presence of Fr. Thaddeus MacVicar, who helped at the parish and organized a Secular Franciscan fraternity in nearby Sunnyside. Fr. Aidan Neenan, the vocation director, visited Joe's school in the fall of 1953 and invited him to attend the seminary high school, Glenclyffe, in Garrison, N.Y. On a visit to Glenclyffe, Joe saw some of his friends, including future friar Fr. Gary McAuley. Seeing their familiar faces convinced him

to enroll. He graduated from Glenclyffe and entered novitiate in August 1958. He was ordained to the priesthood on Nov. 12, 1966, at Sacred Heart Church in Yonkers, N.Y.

Father Joe subsequently earned master's degrees in divinity, theology, and pastoral counseling, and eventually a doctorate of ministry. His academic training complemented his practical training in pastoral care gained through five years counseling students at St. Michael High School and summers directing a tutorial program that he started for disadvantaged youths. He modeled the tutorial program after "Summer in the City" at Our Lady Queen of Angels in East Harlem, where as a clerical candidate in the 1960s he taught English, mathematics, physical education, and arts. He had also taught religion and directed intramural football at Sacred Heart High School in Yonkers.

These experiences in the religious formation of youth served Father Joe well when he was called to serve in the formation of Capuchin friars. Recommended for his pastoral experience, in 1976 Father Joe joined the formation staff for the clerical candidates in residence at Garrison. As a formator of clerics, he was director of field work, director of the deacon internship program, and finally director of formation. At the same time, he joined the faculty at Maryknoll School of Theology in Ossining, N.Y., directing the field education program. For the next 18 years, until the closing of the school, he would teach courses on pastoral counseling, cross-cultural ministry, and justice and peace, among others.

After Maryknoll closed, he brought his pastoral skills to Manhattanville College, 1994-99, as chaplain in residence and director of the campus ministry office. He became chaplain at The College of New Rochelle in 2002 while residing at Saint Conrad Friary, White Plains, N.Y. He also served as chaplain to Ladycliff College in Highland Falls, N.Y. These assignments were the joy of his priestly ministry.

In his later years, Father Joe ministered part-time as chaplain at White Plains Hospital until his health declined. He moved to St. Clare Friary in Yonkers and then to the nursing center Cabrini of Westchester in Dobbs Ferry, N.Y., where he died peacefully.

Father Jack, who lived and worked with Father Joe for many years in both formation ministry and college chaplaincy, bid the funeral assembly to imitate the example of Jesus Christ, St. Francis of Assisi, and Father Joe, leaking light, love, and truth into the Church and into the world. He asked Father Joe to intercede for us that we, too, may live "rich, gentle lives."

and dreaming, like me, of chasubles.



Br. Paul Crawford, 72, Served Manchester for 33 Years



He came from the Bay State and embedded himself in the Granite State. And like granite, his dedication to God, to the Church, to the community, and to Capuchin life proved durable.

For 33 years, from 1987 to 2020, Br. Paul Crawford, who died on Feb. 23, faithfully served the people of God in Manchester, N.H. He was a pastoral associate, youth

minister, and religious education director at Blessed Sacrament Parish (1987-2002) and an outreach coordinator for Catholic Charities in the Diocese of Manchester (2002-11). He held other offices in the diocese as well. From 2002 he resided at St. Anne-St. Augustin Friary and served for six years as guardian of the Capuchin fraternity.

Brother Paul was a longtime advocate for social justice, serving as president of the board of directors of the Franciscan Action Network in Washington, D.C., and past president of the Granite State Organizing Project in Manchester.

This resumé only begins to reveal the character of this affable, generous, good-humored friar who wove himself into the fabric of the communities he served.

"It was just in his nature to get involved," said Fr. Samuel Fuller, who lived with Brother Paul for five years in Manchester

and delivered the homily at his funeral on Feb. 27. He commended Brother Paul for living into the Beatitudes of Jesus Christ and opening himself effectively to God's grace and love in every time and season of his life.

Brother Paul was born to Paul and Mary Manning Crawford in Boston, Mass., on Feb. 9, 1952. He and his siblings grew up in Dorchester, Mass., where he attended St. Margaret's School, then Gate of Heaven High School in South Boston. Years later, he received his B.S. in human services from Springfield College, Springfield, Mass., and an M.S.W. degree in social work from Boston College.

Brother Paul entered the Capuchin Order on Aug. 31, 1969, and pronounced perpetual vows on Sept. 4, 1976. Much of his initial formation was spent at St. Anthony Friary in Hudson, N.H., where he was entrusted with the traditional duties of a lay brother, including laundry and tailoring. After nearly three years of domestic work at Sacred Heart Friary, Yonkers, N.Y. (1975-78), he became porter at St. John the Baptist Friary in New York City. For the next nine years he ministered to midtown Manhattan's transient residents, establishing the St. John Bread of Life Food Pantry. He was also involved in the charismatic renewal movement.

Everywhere he lived, Brother Paul brought his relational skills to the local fraternity. Father Sam noted that he had an uncanny way of knowing what his fellow friars were doing, often surprising them with his knowledge of their whereabouts! Around the Province, any friar whose birthday was approaching could be sure of this— that the first birthday card to arrive in the mail would be from Brother Paul.

He resided at St. Clare Friary, Yonkers, N.Y., from July 2020 until his death. To the end he continued to work for social justice, chairing the provincial justice, peace, and integrity of creation commission and supporting refugee resettlement in Westchester County. He remained fiercely loyal to his beloved New England sports teams and to the people he served in Manchester, who were just as fiercely loyal to him.

New Branding for Youth Ministries

As Capuchin Family Ministries launches its 2024 summer programs, it simultaneously launches a new logo!

Since the relaunch of Capuchin Youth & Family Ministries a few years ago, the Province sought a new look to go with the new model of ministry. The new logo incorporates a tau cross, bringing distinctive Franciscan imagery from the old logo, and much of the former name. "Capuchin Family Ministries" simplifies the brand while reflecting the constituency it has always served. "Our goal has always been to build up people's identity as Catholics in the world, and we will continue to serve people of all ages, including youth," said Fr. Erik Lenhart, chaplain. "Our programs provide the time and space for people to encounter God through prayer, service to others, and the sacraments. We spark men and women, young and old, in ways meaningful to them and that they can live out long after the program's conclusion."



New Phase for Okinawa Mission

The Capuchin mission in Okinawa is entering a new phase of life.

The Custody of Japan was transformed into a delegation of the Province after a decree by the general minister of the Order, Fr. Roberto Genuin, on Jan. 20. This change in canonical status reflects the lack of local vocations in Japan and the dwindling number of friars in the jurisdiction, which has been staffed mainly by friars from Holy Trinity Province, Karnataka, India. A provincial delegation is one degree below that of a provincial custody. Friars in a delegation do not elect a *custos* (custodial minister) or custodial council. The provincial minister appoints a delegate and two councilors and grants authority to the delegate to govern the delegation. Accordingly, Fr. Robert Abbatiello appointed Fr. Maxim D'Souza as delegate, Fr. Naveen Joseph Sequeira as first councilor, and Fr. Vincent Praveen Kumar as second councilor.

Brothers of the Americas Unite a Second Time

Building on their inaugural gathering in Brazil two years ago, the Capuchins of North and South America reunited for a week in Colombia, Feb. 4-11, to promote fraternal collaboration, formation, and mission.

The 50 friars who came to Bogotá held plenary and small-group discussions around the Capuchin charisms and their intersection with our apostolic activities. They discussed the initial and continuing formation of friars. They held conversations about the St. Lawrence of Brindisi fraternities, the Order's project to establish intentional, international communities in mission fields. By the end of the week, they approved statutes in these and other areas to bring to the general chapter of the Order in August.

Each day, the friars made an offering of their prayers: for recently deceased brothers, for brothers who recently professed perpetual vows, for the Capuchin Poor Clare sisters, and for our sick or elderly brothers.

Representing our Province at the gathering were Fr. Robert Abbatiello, provincial minister; Br. Celestino Arias,

member of the general council of the order; **Br. James Donegan**, a provincial councilor and mission director; and post-novice Br. Leo Rojas, who comes from Venezuela. The next, third, pan-American gathering will take place in North America in 2027.

Welcome, Brother Divya!




Our fraternal collaboration with the friars of the Holy Trinity Province of Karnataka, India, continues to be strong. On Jan. 5, our brother Fr. Divya Karunesh arrived at Our Lady of Sorrows Friary. He is now the newest member of the Our Lady of Sorrows fraternity and will be serving as parochial vicar at Our Lady of Sorrows

and St. Mary Parishes on the Lower East Side of Manhattan.

Father Divya was born in Hassan, Karnataka, in 1984. He was invested as a novice in the Capuchin Order in 2004, made his perpetual profession of vows on May 3, 2012, and was ordained a priest exactly two years later. This is his first assignment in the United States.

Let us welcome our brother to our fraternal life and ministry in the Province of St. Mary!

ith record numbers of undocumented immigrants coming to the United States every day, there is a lot of fear, anxiety, and anger being voiced in our cities, the media, and the government. In this clamor it can be hard to remember that in the end, immigrants are our neighbors—brothers and sisters in need. And these, our newest neighbors, face many challenges just to survive in a new country.

The Church has always known this and has heeded God's word to us about our immigrant brothers and sisters. This is the word that Fr. Scott Leet hears as he helps migrants seek asylum and legal status.

Currently the parochial vicar at Church of the Good Shepherd in Inwood, Manhattan, Father Scott dedicates one day a week at Cabrini Immigration Services in Washington Heights. "With all of the duties I have at Church of the Good Shepherd, my pastor, Fr. Tom Faiola, very kindly allows me to dedicate every Wednesday to work at Cabrini," he says. "To me it is amazing how God integrates our experience in such a way that they feed and support each other to make us better ministers. The work I do at the church influences the work at Cabrini and vice versa. Each helps me to empathize with those I am ministering to."

Cabrini Immigration Services is a non-profit, faith-based community organization that offers a broad range of services to immigrants and their families. There is legal aid for the undocumented, scholarships for the college-bound, and food pantries for the hungry. Founded in 1999, the agency is run out of the St. Frances Cabrini Shrine in Washington Heights by a team of staff, volunteers, and professionals who offer their services at deeply discounted rates or even free of charge, depending on the need.

Father Scott, who was formerly an assistant district attorney for the Manhattan District Attorney's office, brings his professional skills to Cabrini. "Low-income immigrants in New York City seeking legal help are vulnerable to scams and other abuses," he said. "My background in the law and the expertise of other lawyers at Cabrini allows us to help them avoid all that." He offers his expertise in three areas: initial legal consultation, legal services for asylum, and legal support for Special Immigrant Juvenile Status.

Guidance

When they first come to Cabrini, immigrants seeking legal counsel are first given a free consultation by one of the agency lawyers like Father Scott. In 2023, Cabrini conducted 964 consultations. Attorneys provide each client with information about their rights, screen them for immigration relief eligibility, and inform them about their legal options. Clients also meet with a social worker who assesses their social service needs.

Usually, Father Scott interviews clients at the Cabrini offices, but sometimes he does so at Good Shepherd. All immigration law services are provided in Spanish and English, and Father Scott has become a fluent Spanish speaker. "Interviewees come from all over, but currently mostly from Venezuela," he says. "Sadly, in most cases, we determine that there is not a viable case for asylum, but we keep trying, and often we are able to help those that qualify." Once an individual has been found to have a case for asylum, Father Scott and others get to work guiding them through the legal morass ahead.

Father Scott, who was trained as a trial lawyer, has come to understand the complexities of immigration law thanks to Cabrini. "In the DA's office, I dealt largely with criminal cases that did not completely prepare me for this. But study and the advice of my colleagues at Cabrini have been invaluable," he says.

Asylum requirements are very rigorous. Applicants must plead their case, which means proving that an immigrant or a family member was persecuted in their home country. Economic hardship is not considered a valid cause. They must file within a year of arriving in the United States, but all too often, this doesn't happen. "People who make claims when they reach the border have a 'credible fear evaluation,' "says Father Scott. "These Spanish speakers receive a packet—in English." Many immigrants simply do not understand the documents they have received. Thus they do not file the paperwork, they miss the filing deadline, and they become ineligible for asylum automatically.

Triumph and Heartbreak

Father Scott devotes a portion of his time aiding youths seeking Special Immigrant Juvenile Status. Qualifying youth under 21 years of age with parental problems may be eligible to remain in the United States. Father Scott shared one particular story, both joyful and heart-breaking: "A 19-year-old young man came in after being abandoned by his father. He came with his mother, who was in deportation proceedings. In October of 2023, after a seven-to-eight-month process, his juvenile status was approved.

"His status is now like a DACA recipient," he said. "He has permission to work and will wait four to five years for a visa, after which he can get a green card and then citizenship." He points out how bittersweet these triumphs can be: "Sadly, this young man will never be allowed to apply to take care of his mother."



An Unconventional Path

The Holy Spirit has taken Fr. Scott Leet down an unconventional path into service.

After receiving his bachelor's degree from DePauw University in 1989, he took a pilgrimage to Medjugorje, site of the 1981 Marian apparitions. A chance encounter with our Capuchin friar Fr. Oliver O'Connor (d. 2008) led to Scott's introduction to the Province of St. Mary. He pondered his call while serving for two years in the Peace Corps in Zaire (today known as Democratic Republic of the Congo). Upon his return to the U.S., Scott joined the Capuchin Order, completing his novitiate in 1995. During his post-novitiate formation, he completed two years of theology at Seton Hall University. Then, he felt called anew. He wanted to practice law. "I had a desire to see justice done, to help those voiceless that get caught up in our legal system."

Scott graduated from Fordham University Law School in 2001 and passed the New York State bar exam the next year. He began his career with the New York County (Manhattan) District Attorney's Office in New York City. "I originally wanted to be a defense attorney, but I was convinced by a mentor that as a prosecutor, I could serve as a gatekeeper to keep people out of the system that did not belong there."

With the Manhattan District Attorney's office he prosecuted over 1,200 cases. He served in several different units, including welfare fraud, sex crimes, domestic violence, and homicide. He concluded his career as the bureau chief of the trial division in the Office of the Special Narcotics Prosecutor for the City of New York. He was also an adjunct faculty member for nine years at Fordham Law School.

Eventually, he felt drawn to the Capuchins again, and he returned to the Province in 2015. During his formation he stayed for extended periods in Bolivia and Guatemala, immersing himself in the cultures of Latin America. He professed his perpetual vows in 2020. He was ordained to the priesthood on June 25, 2022. Now, he brings his 13 years of experience as an attorney and his love for all of God's people to the immigrants who come to Cabrini Immigration Services.

Though not a conventional path, Father Scott feels that his vocation as a lawyer, friar, and priest was meant to be. "If I look back on my life arc I can see God's hand," he says. "There is no question in my mind that I needed to study law. I needed the 17 years outside the Order to serve as I do now. When I look back, it is incredible to me. God has shown me so much in my path."

rom the beginning of the Franciscan movement 800 years ago, friars have always trusted in divine providence to supply the needs of their fraternities, the Church, and the people they serve. This trust, combined with a humble approach to ministry and a tireless work ethic, has gained the friars the means to continue their mission of proclaiming the Gospel with their lives.

Providing for the Capuchin mission today in New York, New England, and beyond demands of us a similar trust in God as well as a strategy for inviting others to be agents of God's generosity.

Works and Needs

The works of the friars are many, and so are the needs.

We friars of the Province of St. Mary have devoted ourselves to the service of God's people across an array of ministries, from parishes and schools to colleges, hospitals, prisons, and the military. We preach missions and retreats. We offer spiritual direction. Across our parishes we sponsor food pantries, a soup kitchen, and even a shelter for homeless women. Beyond the Church, we are counselors, nurses, and social workers, and we work at nonprofits and NGOs.

In addition, we sponsor two of our own ministries. Capuchin Family Ministries evangelizes youth and young adults through annual service projects and our theater camp. Capuchin Mobile Ministries provides spiritual care to the homeless and brings the welcome of Christ to the streets.

The American economy has become a gig economy, and the friars, too, often take gig assignments, like baptisms, marriages, and funerals. All our clerical friars, including those who do not work at our Capuchin parishes, celebrate Mass on weekdays and on weekends, helping other parishes who need priests.

As we pursue these good works for the Church and society, we also sustain the welfare of our fraternities by recruiting and training new friars and caring for our senior friars.

Like any household, our fraternities need to make ends meet and provide the basic necessities of food, shelter, education, health care, and transportation. Like any business, we have to pay the bills, pay our employees, and keep our facilities and properties in good condition.

However, as our fraternities grow older and as the number of new vocations decreases, there are fewer friars in active ministry, which means a reduction in the income we receive through salaries and wages. We are eligible for Medicaid, Medicare, and Social Security benefits like other citizens, but these benefits only go so far. The friars who work in internal ministries like formation, senior care, and administration generally do not draw salaries from their work.



With the recognition that our work alone will not cover all our needs, we humbly make recourse to "the table of the Lord" and ask for your help to sustain our way of life.

Development

Through the provincial development office, we solicit donations and gifts through various means, and we communicate through print and electronic media how we use the resources you provide us so generously. There are a number of ways we do this.

We use direct mail to send appeals to thousands of people throughout the United States. There are monthly appeals in honor of St. Anthony of Padua and St. Padre Pio purposed for the general needs of the Province. There are also special appeals for the formation of new friars, care for the senior friars, or our sponsored ministries. Through these solicitations we enroll constituents in our Capuchin Mission Association and promise to remember them in our prayers in gratitude for their support of our domestic and international missions. We also send yearend Christmas cards to our most generous benefactors. And of course, we send you *The Capuchin Journey* four times a year to let you know how we fulfill our mission.

We organize fundraiser events within the Province to celebrate the good works of the friars and to honor our dedicated supporters. In the last two months of 2023, we held four events: two in Boston for the benefit of Capuchin Mobile Ministries, including a dinner at Cathedral of the Holy Cross with Cardinal Sean O'Malley; and two events in Westchester County, an Advent breakfast at St. Joseph Seminary in Yonkers, N.Y., and a Christmas party in Pelham, N.Y. Collectively, these events drew in over 600 people and raised over \$200,000. Thank you, everyone!

We are ramping up our electronic giving options. Credit card donations, both one-time and recurring (monthly) gifts, are just one option. Did you know we have a Venmo account? Did you know you can give through a payroll deduction? We do, and you can!

We establish memorial scholarships for our young friars. Through the Capuchin Burse Program, you can honor a loved one, living or deceased, and fund the recruitment and training of a new generation of friars. You can open a burse with a gift of \$100 and add contributions at any time. A burse is complete at \$5,000. Your generosity is an investment in the future of the Capuchin mission in New York and New England. Contributions to the burses are thus forever a part of the prayers, Masses, and good works of the friars of the Province.

We help benefactors make planned gifts. The support we receive through planned gifts provides us the resources necessary to continue our pastoral care for God's people long into the future. Planned gifts include charitable trusts and gifts through estate plans, including wills, trusts, retirement plans, and life insurance. Individuals who make planned gift commitments to the Province become members of our Capuchin Legacy Society. Members are forever remembered in the daily Masses and prayers offered by the friars and have their name inscribed in the Society's Book of Honor. 
